New international instrument on plastic pollution

- UNEA-5 (2022): adoption of an **historic decision** (Resolution 5/14) establishing an Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC) to develop a global legally binding instrument on plastic pollution, including the marine environment.
- Only 9% of the world's plastic is recycled, and plastic production is expected to **triple by 2060**. "This is the most important multilateral environmental agreement since the Paris Agreement," (Inger Andersen, UNEP).
- The future instrument is to be based on a comprehensive approach that addresses the **full life cycle of plastic**, including its production, design and disposal. It addresses the impact on plastic both on the environment and the health.
- The INC includes Members (countries) and **observers** (larger group of civil society, private sector, academia, waste pickers, youth, and local and subnational governments).

INC 4: main outcomes

- More than 2 500 participants
- Objectives: reduce the draft text produced after INC3 and confirm intersessional work before INC5
- Streamlined and bracketed [3.686] zero draft text
- Progress in the different contact groups
- Scope of the treaty: Waste management VS plastic full life-cycle
- Consensus VS majority voting
- Two major groups: High Ambition Coalition vs "like minded group"

Before INC5 – intersessional work (August, Bangkok)

Group 1: Means of Implementation

Group 2: Product design and approaches to plastic products and chemicals of concern

INC5: November 25 to December 1 in Busan, Republic of Korea

Coalition priorities:

- Coalition engagement (increase the Coalition members and signatories)
- 2. Involvement in the negotiation process (prepare a new position for LSNG)
 - Call for interested cities and subnational governments to play a leadership role with their national governments
